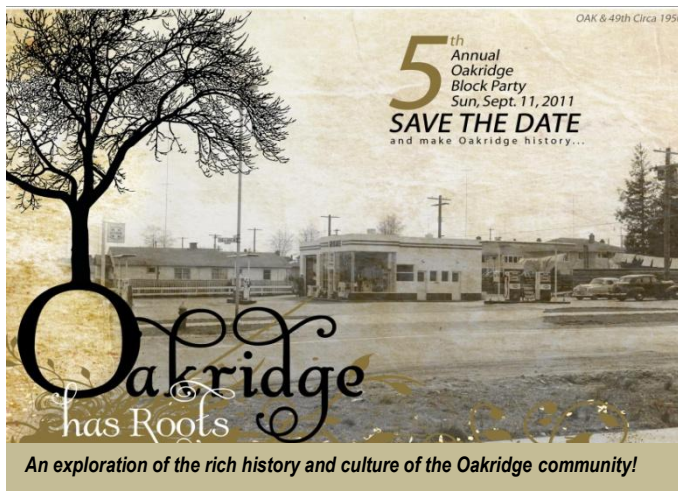

Event Overview

The sound of laughter echoes down the street! Eager families head toward Baillie Street anxious not to miss a minute of fun – the party's already started! 'Wow, look at the **vintage cars!** So that's what Oakridge transportation looked like in the 1950!"

Cheerful volunteers greet kids and their parents as they line up to meet **Bobs and Lolo**, local children's performing artists. **The Carnival Band** plays popular tunes as they stroll along the street and neighbours stop to greet each other. "Hey, nice to see you! How was your summer?" They catch up on the latest news as they stroll down the block. "I can't believe the great weather today," one man comments. "Remember all the rain we had last year during the block party? I still can't believe how many of us showed up in that downpour!"

Dozens of **local organizations and businesses** share information about their programs and services and display information about their history. The **Vancouver 125** booth is busy sharing details about the City's special anniversary year. In the courtyard area the **1950's style BBQ** is serving up sizzling hotdogs, chili fries, and marsh mellow salad for dessert. "Now this is what I ate when I was your age," a mom tells her teenager. "This was *real* food!"

All too soon the block party draws to a close, as contented Oakridge residents walk up the street towards home, "I come every year and it just keeps getting better and better," a happy voice says. "I think we have the best community festival in all Vancouver!"
